Omolabake Fadeyibi founded LabakCare in 2006 to help those who were not able to get proper health care treatment. She is always thinking of ways to help underprivileged communities both domestically and internationally. Her close family and close friends sometimes tease her and say "you are on a mission to save the world."

Omolabake's nursing career started back in Lagos, Nigeria when she graduated from nursing School in 1977 and midwifery school in 1980. She worked in nursing as well as mid-wifery positions in Government Hospitals in Lagos, Nigeria. She became a public Health Nurse in 1985

and worked as a Public Health Nursing Sister in a Health Center in Lagos Nigeria.

In the US, Omolabake worked as a registered nurse in labor and delivery at the Temple University Hospital in Philadelphia for several years till 2009. She started teaching clinical nursing as an adjunct professor of nursing in maternity, health assessment, and community health nursing since 2005 till present. She also presently works as a Women's Health Nurse Practitioner for FamCare Inc that serves the low or no income communities in Vineland NJ.

In March 2016, she led a team of doctors and nurse practitioners on a medical mission to Ogun State: Abeokuta and Aiyetoro. She and her organization LabakCare, have been going to various parts of Nigeria on medical mission since 2006.

This particular Ogun State: Abeokuta and Aiyetoro mission was inspired by a conversation she had with our esteemed Principal, Chief L.A. Sofenwa during his visit to our reunion in 2013 at Maryland. Mrs. Fadeyibi was moved by Chief Sofenwa's special request that she takes a mission to our Alma-Mata and she promptly placed this on her agenda.

The mission was a success, and with the contributions from Compronians from Nigeria, the team from the USA was able to carry out a very fulfilling mission.
